AIDS BAREFOOT DOCTORS

The AIDS Barefoot Doctors program enables community health workers to provide home-based care, group therapy, and education to people living with HIV/AIDS.



COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

Villages of Hope are communities in which SOTENI delivers need-based programming, such as health clinics, community centers, and incomegenerating activities.



CLEAN WATER

Safe Drinking Water Program, our AIDS Barefoot Doctors provide access to safe drinking water to people living with HIV/AIDS and their families.



SWAZI SHEROES

Swazi SHEROES is a holistic economic empowerment program for women and girls living in Eswatini who are at high risk of contracting HIV/AIDS.

P&G CHILDREN'S SAFE DRINKING WATER

Since 2010, the P&G Children's Safe Drinking Water Program enabled SOTENI's AIDS Barefoot Doctors to provide clean water to the nearly 3,000 persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families in our Villages. Clean water reduces water borne illnesses and improves health and quality of life. This partnership is transitioning our communities to longer-term, sustainable water solutions, so stay tuned for more updates in the coming months!

INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION

The implementation of the SOTENI Village Health and Wealth Project, generously funded by a grant from the International Foundation, was a highlight of the year. This project aims to improve quality of life and healthcare for some of Kenya's most isolated and poverty-stricken regions, where resources are scarce and access to healthcare is extremely limited. To accomplish these goals, SOTENI recruited specialists to provide AIDS Barefoot Doctors (ABDs) with further training in women's health and general health. With their new skills, they have been able to expand their outreach to address the high rates of teen pregnancy and emergent health crises such as COVID-19 in the context of extreme poverty. The SOTENI Village Health and Wealth Project also bolsters the success of support groups with an income-generating component. ABDs were trained in tactics for starting women-led businesses that will provide critical skills and generate income for some 3,000 of the most vulnerable members of the community—those living with HIV/AIDS.



Village of Hope UGUNJA

Thanks to the support of SOTENI International and SOTENI Kenya over the past 11 years, SVH Ugunja has been able to serve several HIV Support Groups, with AIDS Barefoot Doctors (ABDs) conducting monthly health education sessions. Session topics range from drug adherence, group and time management, COVID-19 prevention, nutrition, water treatment procedures, sanitation, and hygiene. ABDs also provide condoms to group members and demonstrate condom use and disposal. Apart from health education sessions, ABDs distribute P&G water purification packets to clients every month.

ABDs are much appreciated by the community. SVH Ugunja ABDs have bravely traveled to visit clients during these difficult times, ensuring that they have sufficient P&G water purification packets and condoms. Other challenges and learnings we faced this year included adjusting our service delivery strategy. We realized that emergency funds were needed to ensure that our client's emerging needs could be met and to prepare for future pandemics and outbreaks. Community members rely heavily on SVH Ugunja given the success of past public health projects.

SVH Mbakalo dispensary was awarded special self-help funds from the US Embassy to upgrade its maternity and laboratory clinic equipment. This project expanded the clinic's medical services. The clinic's credentials were further boosted with its laboratory registration by the Kenya Medical Laboratory Technicians and Technologist Board.

our clinical staff. CHAK donated
dust coats for clinical staff and over
\$15,000 worth of medicines. We
also received additional medical
equipment from Missions for
Essentials Drugs and Supplies via
our long-standing partnership.

We would also like to recognize and acknowledge Dr. Ellen Bowman and Dr. Hema Krishnan for their generous gift which led to the establishment of the clinic's COVID-19 Vaccination Centre, which started operations on January 26, 2022. To date, over 1,500 community members have been fully vaccinated at the clinic and more are being educated on COVID-19 prevention through the outreach program.

Special thanks to Dr. Victoria Wulsin for her continued support and commitment to enabling SVH Mbakalo to serve the community.

The school management and students greatly appreciated the supplies and training.

A Message from Swazi SHEROES

Swazi SHEROES has made great strides over the past year. Despite COVID-19 restrictions and political unrest in Eswatini, we've made tremendous progress in establishing income generating activities for vulnerable young women. Using our new production space, participants have created lines of handbags, clutches, children's clothing,

and throw pillows. They have sold their items at local craft fairs and have begun marketing them in the U.S. In addition, SHEROES has provided wrap-around mental health and career support services, offering hope and encouragement to young women otherwise struggling with depression and loss. This has been a year of transition, which means a lot of changes took place. 2021 ushered in a slow but steady transition from COVID-19 restrictions to the resumption of "normal" operations. Kenya is very proud to have contributed to the fight against the pandemic by setting up a vaccination center at the clinic in SOTENI Village of Hope-Mbakalo, made possible by the generous giving of donors.

This year has also seen the adoption of new technology that has transformed field data collection. Thanks to a grant from the International Foundation, 17 AIDS Barefoot Doctors are collecting and reporting data in real-time through their phones using an app called CommCare.

In collaboration with SOTENI International,

we designed a plan to transition community members from using P&G sachets to more sustainable, long-term clean water solutions. Stay tuned for more information in the near future!

In October, I had to say goodbye to my colleague and friend, Jenny Brady. Jenny's confidence in taking on a challenge was admirable. 
